Letter to Supporters: The Dawning of a New Chapter for MBC

Dear Friends of Multiple Births Canada,

When I look back at the 2022-2023 fiscal year, I see the dawning of a new chapter... and I don't mean one of our regional groups. The Covid-19 pandemic lasted much longer than anyone could have imagined and the effects of it had a much larger impact than anyone thought possible. Just like so many other organizations, Multiple Births Canada and all multiple birth organizations are forever changed by the way the world has evolved through this period. Though we crave social interaction, connecting with others through our screens has become the norm. Stress and anxiety levels have risen, children missed out on essential opportunities to socialize and learn. Multiple birth families struggled with these challenges on top of the usual stresses that we have always faced. Despite this, we persevered and held our first in-person conference since the pandemic. The time that we spent in Mattawa, Ontario together was both healing and inspiring. Many of our volunteers are tired and overwhelmed, yet we all felt the call to push forward and begin rebuilding what we had.

The MBC Board evolved in different ways as well. I was thrilled to step into the Chair of the Board role following the 2022 conference and Bryan Segal, enthusiastically took on the Vice-Chair of the Board position. We have been moving towards a more project-based model within the board that includes always having a "buddy" to bounce ideas off of. We also brought in two new board members, Allison Watcher and Shanelle Labach, for Membership and Research & Projects respectively, but just as the pandemic was unpredictable, so too was their availability to volunteer. Sometimes life gets in the way, but the good news is that we moved on and we learned to manage with a smaller team. As we strive to grow our board, our focus is getting 'the right people on the bus" that have a passion for multiple births and a desire to help others.

Our theme this fiscal year was "Demystifying Multiple Births: Sharing Our Unique Stories." In an age of social media, where information and misinformation are spread very quickly, we made a goal of debunking some of the myths and spreading real information about multiple births. Our personal stories have commonalities and messages that bring a

relatable factor to what we experience in our day-to-day lives. We put out three video images to circulate around social media to make people think about some of the common things that parents of multiples hear often in our lives: "You have your hands full" "They must be so expensive" and "You have an instant family." By sharing these posts, MBC helped bridge the gap between what people think about multiple birth families and what multiple birth families know to be true. We used this social media campaign as a call to action to get families to share their stories. In another opportunity to share stories, MBC was approached by the Canadian Children's Literacy Foundation (CCLF) asking us to be a delivery partner on their Lost & Found project, with the objective of collecting the pandemic experience stories of children across Canada. MBC enlisted some excellent volunteers to deliver an online educational program designed by CCLF to help children and caregivers sort through their experiences and emotions and create their story through art, writing, video, etc. These stories were collected and uploaded into an online gallery that is part of Canadian history. It was an honour to partner with CCLF on this and for our members to have an opportunity to be a part of this and most importantly to begin healing together.

The future for MBC looks different, but different can be good. As I mentioned, this is a new chapter for the organization. The needs and the landscape have changed, but the good news is that the board of directors is ready and willing to rebuild in a way that is meaningful to all multiple birth families across Canada. In 2023-2024, we are going to take a good look at our "house" - what we really need, how we do things, and what we ought to be doing and from there we will build. This is us. Thank you for your continued support for Multiple Births Canada. Stay tuned.
